The need for bilingual services is likely to grow in the future. According to the 2000 census, the Chicago metropolitan region is ranked fifth in the nation among regions housing immigrants, with 1,416,890 foreign-born residents calling the Chicago area home. Immigrants make up 20.2 percent of the region's workforce, with one out of every two workers being foreign born.

At one time, large urban centers were the immigrant's gateway to this country. But with more and more employment opportunities found in the suburbs,



many Hispanics are bypassing the city and moving directly to the suburbs. The 2000 census also shows that, for the first time, more immigrants are calling Chicago's suburbs their home, with 788,000 versus 629,000 in the city.

"When the 2009 census figures are released, it's likely those numbers will have increased even more," Patrician explains. "That's going to be a huge market to service. I'm seriously considering all my future hires be fluent in another language, be it Spanish or another language like Polish. The future of customer service, I think, will begin with being fluent in a second language."
